SIGULDA CLASSICS IN GAUJA NATIONAL PARK

Gutman`s Cave – The Bridge across the Gauja River – Adventure Park “Tarzāns” – Bobsleigh and luge track “Sigulda” – Recreation complex “Kaķītis” – Fischer Cross-Country Ski Centre – Pedestrian bridge over the River Gauja – Devil`s Cliffs and Cave – Krimulda Manor – Krimulda Serpentine Road – Bundulītis – Gutman`s Cave

1. GUTMAN`S CAVE (GŪTMAŅA ALA)

The largest cave-grotto in the Baltics. It is the oldest tourist object in Latvia. The inscriptions from 17th century have remained on the walls of the cave. Gutman`s Cave is an ancient place of worship, here people have made sacrifices to their idols. The legend about the Rose of Turaida started in this place.

2. THE BRIDGE ACROSS THE GAUJA RIVER

The first bridge over Gauja River was built in 1936 however it existed a very short amount of time – it was blown up during the World War Two. The existing bridge was built in 1950.

3. ADVENTURE PARK “TARZĀNS”

6. FISCHER CROSS-COUNTRY SKI CENTRE

In the summer the track is used for rollerskating, Nordic walking, and jogging – it is possible because of a tree mulch cover band along the paved portion of the track. The equipment rental, sauna and shower is available.

7. DEVIL`S CLIFFS AND CAVE (VELNALAS KLINTIS UN ALA)

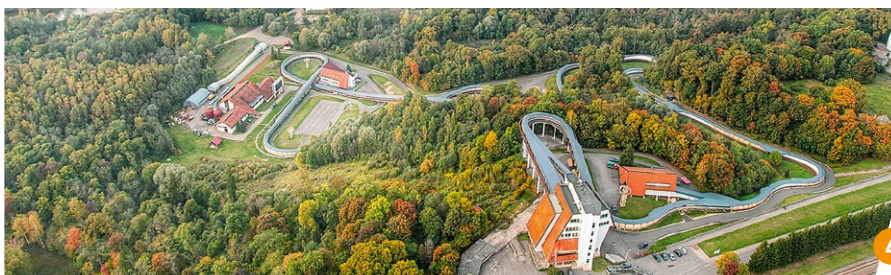
The last greatest rock wall of the Gauja valley, 15 m high, 250 m long. 8 m below water level, the Devil`s cave – an ancient place of worship – has formed in the cliff. It is a protected geological object.

8. GAUJA

The longest river in Latvia flows through a spacious valley. It starts in Vidzeme Upland, casts a wide circle to the Estonian border and flows into the Gulf of Riga near Carnikava. Near Sigulda the Gauja Valley reaches its maximum depth – 85 m.

9. KRIMULDA MANOR

The Classicism style living house of the Livens princes, which was built in 1822, is located near the castle ruins of Riga Domcapitel built in 1255. In the manor complex the Manager`s house, the Coach house, the Swiss house and others can be viewed. By prior arrangement a house wine tasting can be organized. 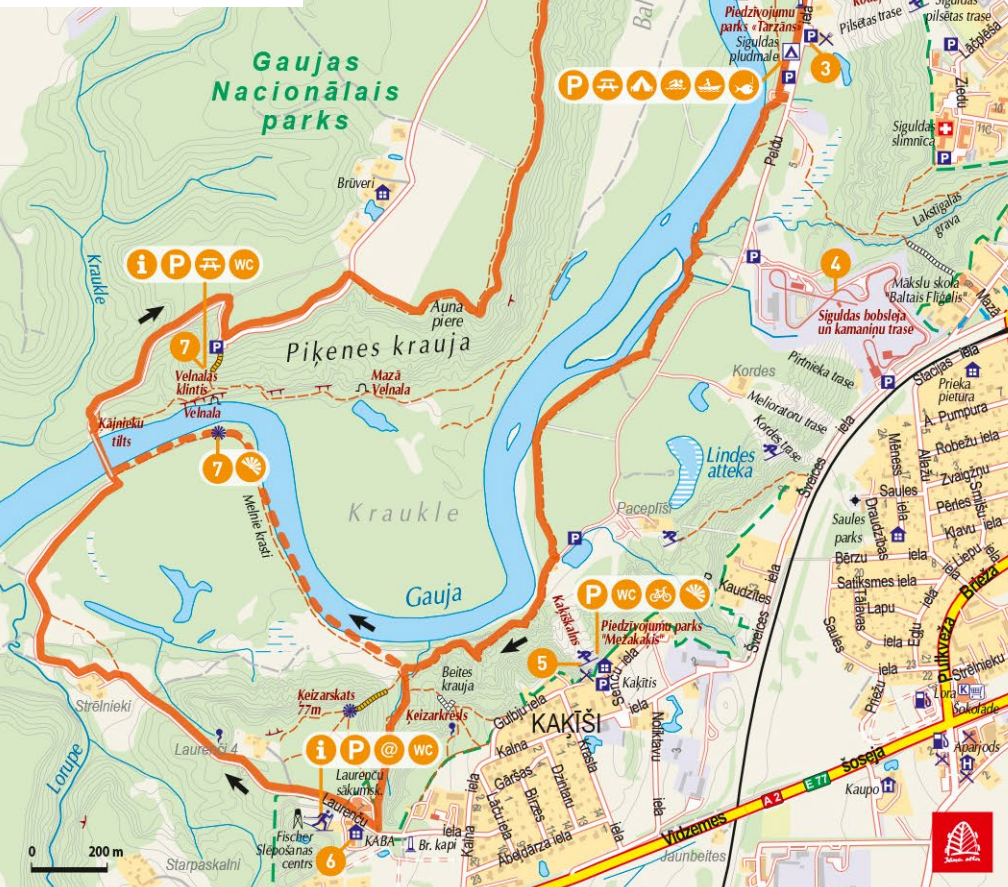

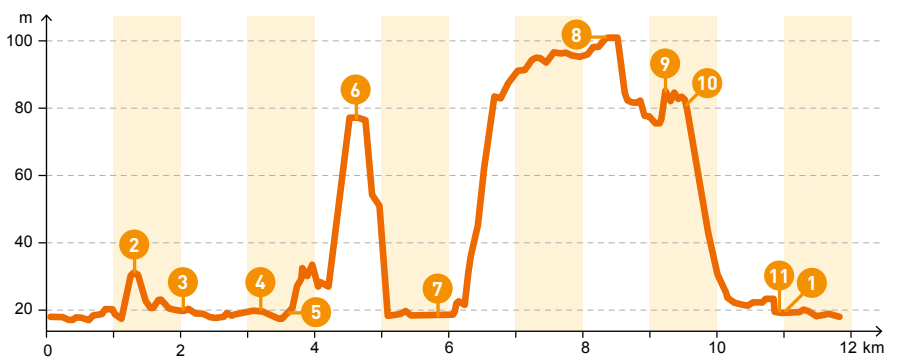


GAUJA NATIONAL PARK

10. KRIMULDA SERPENTINE ROAD
It was built for the first time in 1862 in anticipation of the visit of Russian Tsar Alexander II. In 2006 pavement was applied and lighting lanterns were installed creating a romantic walking place.

11. BUNDULĪTIS
The milk pavilion of Turaida estate "Bundulītis" (The Little Can) More than a hundred years ago local farmers have refreshed the guests of Sigulda with fresh milk and sold walkingsticks.
